CROSS LANE HOSPITAL SCARBOROUGH

Cross Lane Hospital in Scarborough involved the demolition of the majority of the existing buildings on the site and construction of a new build hospital for older people suffering from dementia, offices for the local Trust staff, and a physiotherapy department.

In phase two we extended the existing Ayckbourn Unit to provide male and female inpatient accommodation for Adult Services, including a new reception area and staff facilities. The completed areas were built around secure landscaped gardens and courtyards.













PRINCESS ROAD CLINIC MALTON

The existing offices on the Princess Road Clinic site were demolished allowing us to provide a new two-storey purpose-built day clinic and office building for Mental Health Services in the Malton area. The Kingspan SIPS prefabricated panelling system provided the main structure, clad in brick, render and timber boarding with a slate roof.

SPRINGWOOD COMPLEX MALTON

The new Springwood Unit was built on the Malton Hospital site following the demolition of the existing building. The new unit provided inpatient accommodation for older people requiring complex care and included new en suite bedroom accommodation, day spaces and staff facilities.















PEPPERMILL COURT YORK

In the summer of 2015 the Care Quality Commission closed Bootham Hospital, Tees Esk & Wear Valleys' main inpatient facility for Adults & Older People's Services in York. Whilst the Trust had planned for a new unit in the future, the requirement for accommodation for those patients using the Services at that time and displaced by the closure, created an urgent need for temporary facilities.

We were appointed as Architects for the refurbishment of Peppermill Court, a vacant building in the York portfolio, with work starting on site in the autumn of 2015 on the basis of a negotiated contract with HACS Construction Ltd. The scheme was completed allowing patients to return to the new unit in the summer of 2016.


THE ORCHARDS RIPON

The original Orchards Building in Ripon was designed by Richard Eves Architects as a Community Unit for the elderly in the early 1990s. Over the years the use of the building had changed several times and towards the end of 2012 we were asked by Tees Esk & Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust to work on the refurbishment and extension of the building to provide residential and office accommodation for Adult Mental Health Services in the Harrogate district area. Built on an area of gypsum faults, typical of that part of Ripon, the scheme, which included significant rebuilding and extension, was complicated and, at times, tortuous. However, the completed scheme, which remodelled the original and included a complementary landscaping scheme, was welcomed by both the users and visitors who came to the building.

WORSLEY HUB SELBY

The newWorsley Court building will provide outpatient clinic facilities for Children and Adolescent and Adult and Older People's services in the Selby area. This state-of-the-art 21st century facility will include new open plan offices for all locality Services staff, meeting and training rooms and break-out spaces.

Subject to final approval, the building is due on site in 2019 with completion early in 2020.








BUILDING INFORMATION MODELLING (BIM)
